



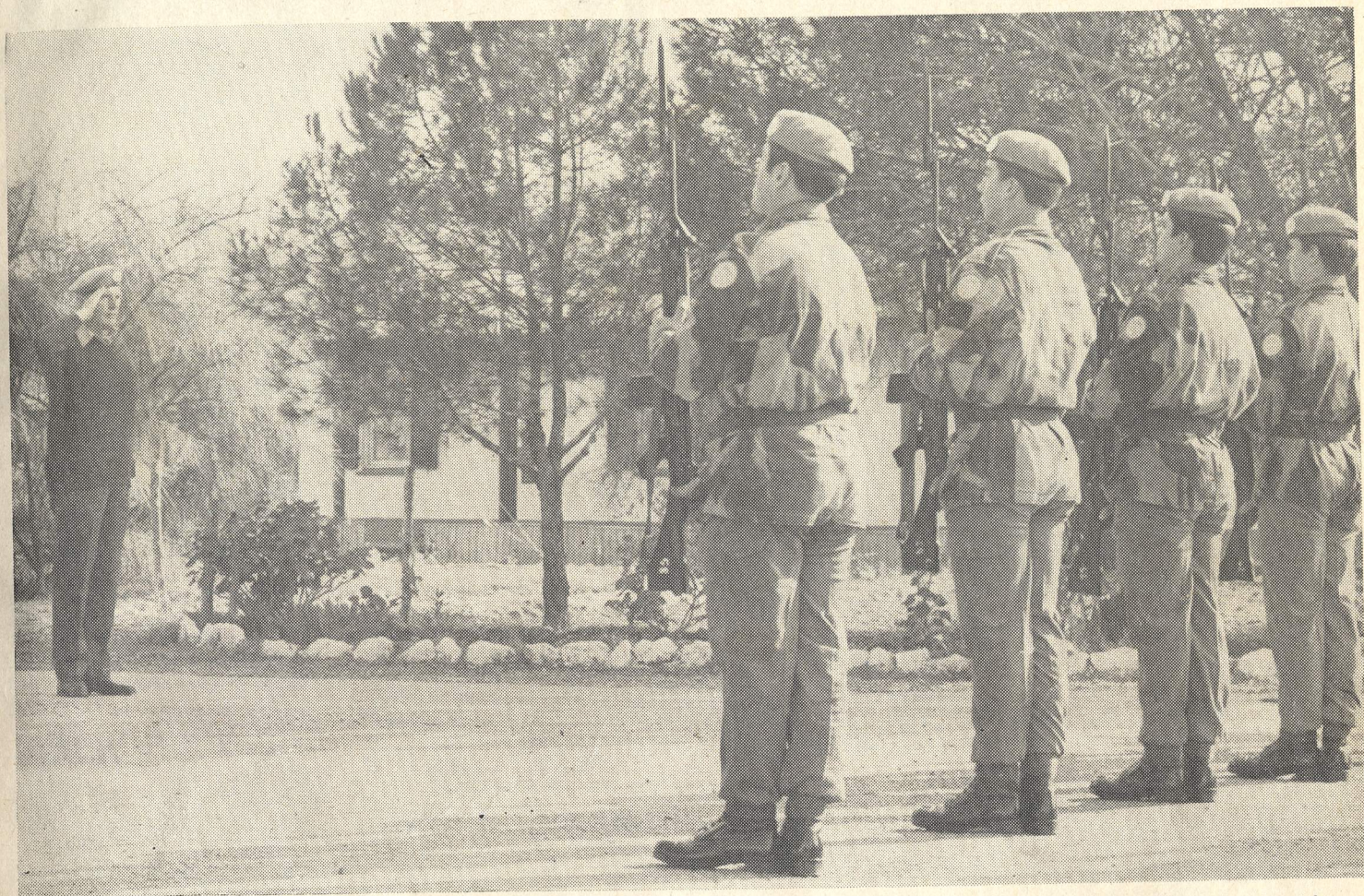

ADC's Change Over



Since taking over command of the Force on 18th December 1976, the new Force Commander Major General J.J. Quinn has been round each of the Sectors to visit the Battalion, to see at first hand what they are doing and what problems exist. This edition of the BLUE BERET shows that, as is the normal military custom, he was welcomed in every camp by a Guard of Honour. There has not been time for him to visit every unit in the Force yet, but he plans to do so by the end of this month.

Last week-end Captain J. Ratia handed over the duties of ADC to the Force Commander to Captain L. Bonthron. Captain Bonthron has come to the Headquarters from the Swedish Contingent where he has been one of the operational duty officers in the Battalion Headquarters since coming to Cyprus on 8th October 1976. He is the third Swedish officer to be the ADC to the Force Commander.

Captain Ratia has had a very busy year as the last ADC to General Prem Chand and the first to General Quinn. He is also a good sportsman and has taken part in every competition he could.

General Quinn is, of course, no stranger to Cyprus or the Force since he was here in 1965 and 1966 as the Assistant Chief of Staff. All the same, since then there have been many changes of organisation and disposition in the Force.

During these visits to the Contingents the Force Commander has been very impressed by the dedication and efficiency shown by everyone he has met, particularly by the junior commanders in the Observation Posts and on patrols.

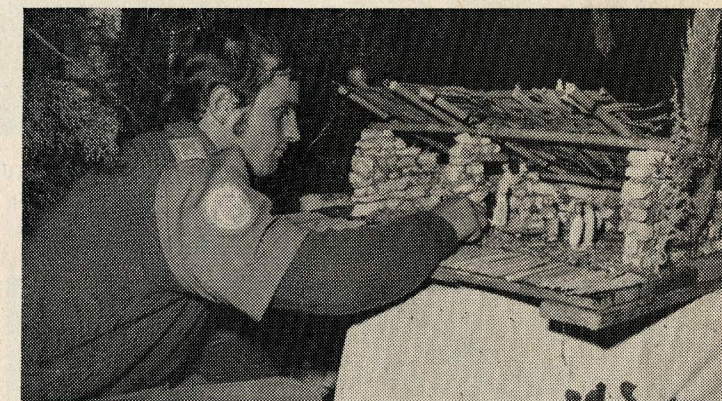
It fits — or eat less!

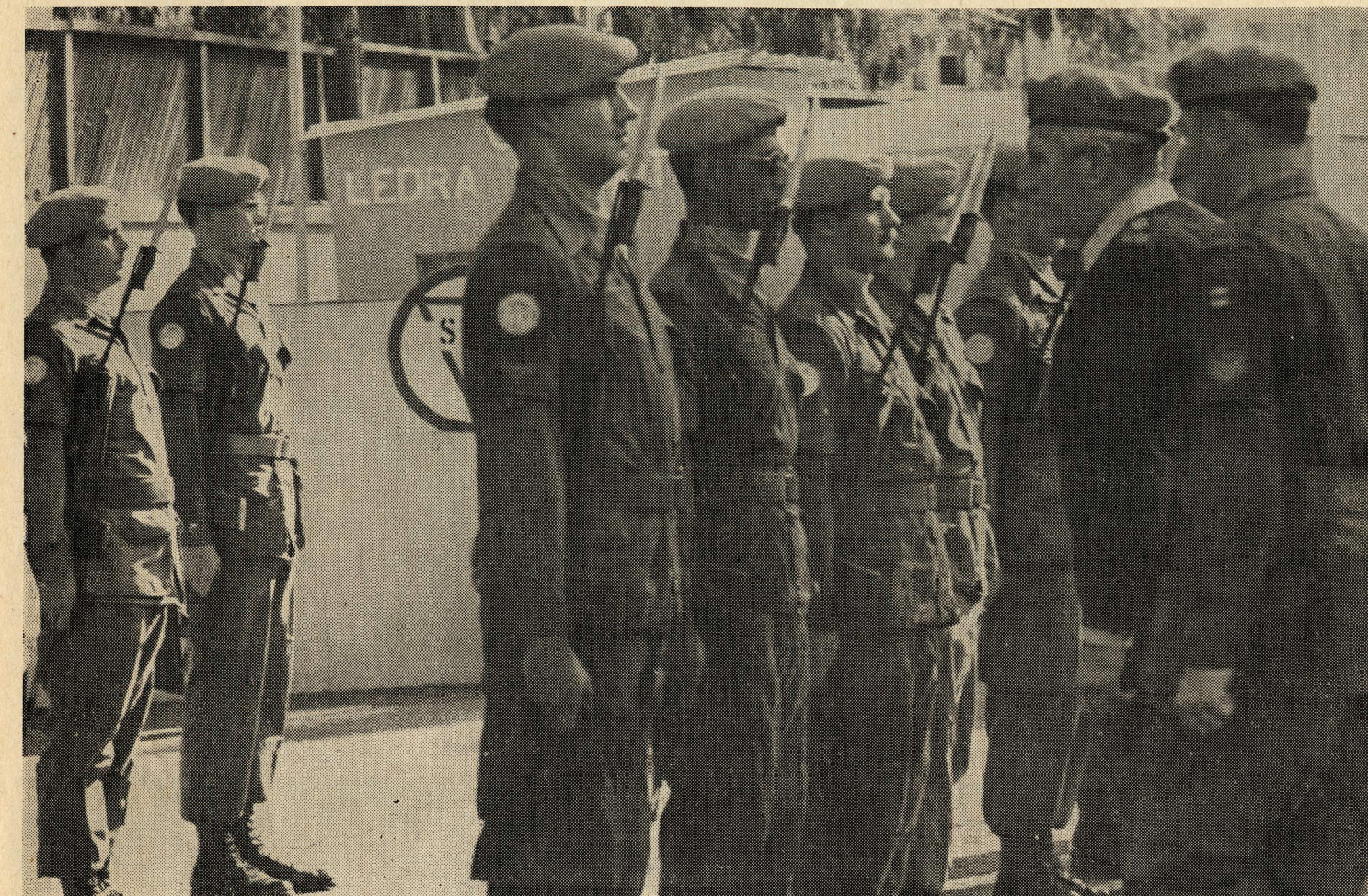

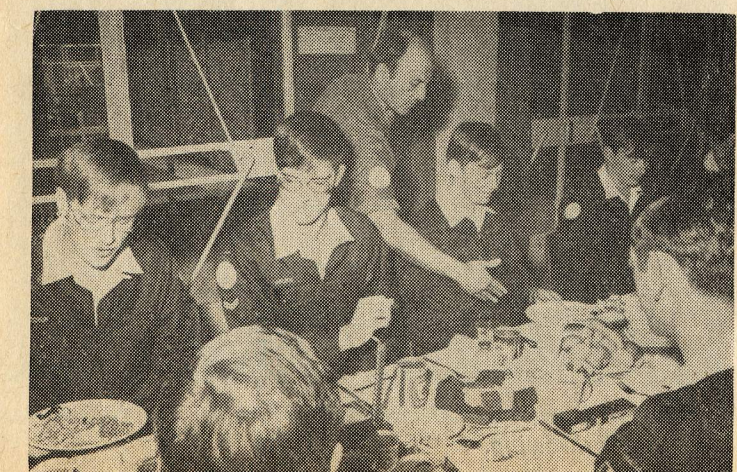


General Quinn inspecting his first Canadian Guard of Honour as Force Commander.

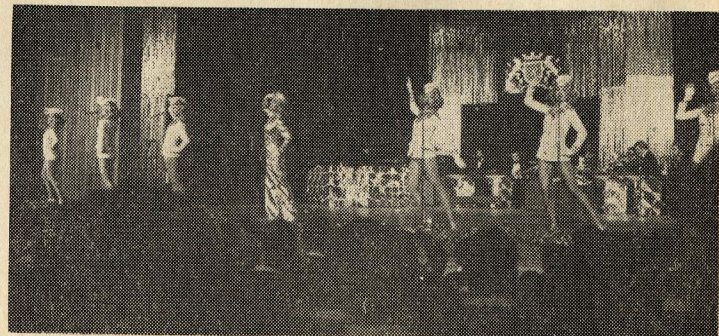
