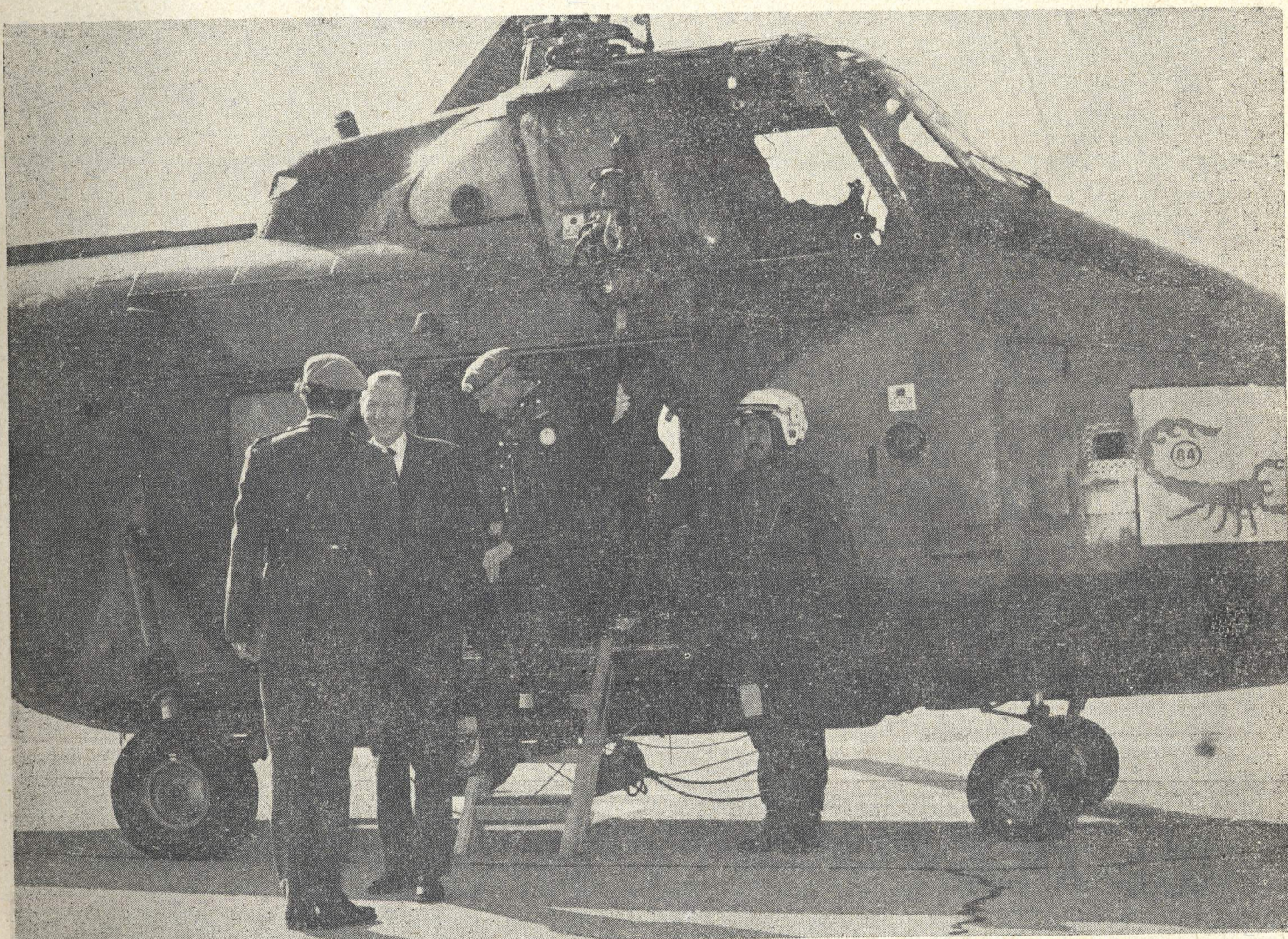

# DR WALDHEIM IN CYPRUS



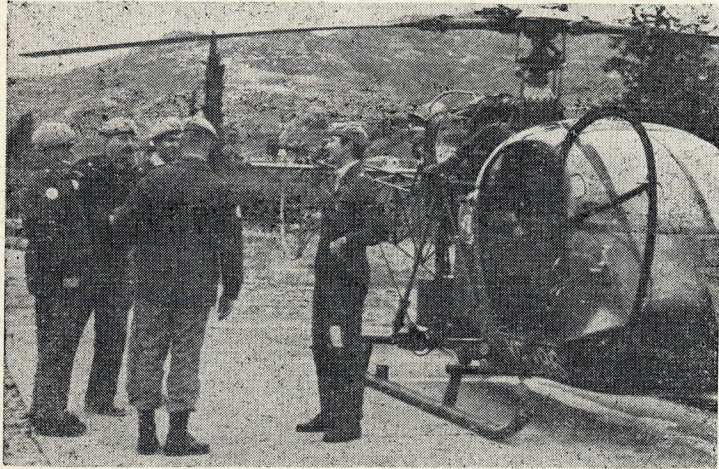

The Secretary General is seen above being greeted by the Chief of Staff on his arrival at Nicosia and inspecting the guard.



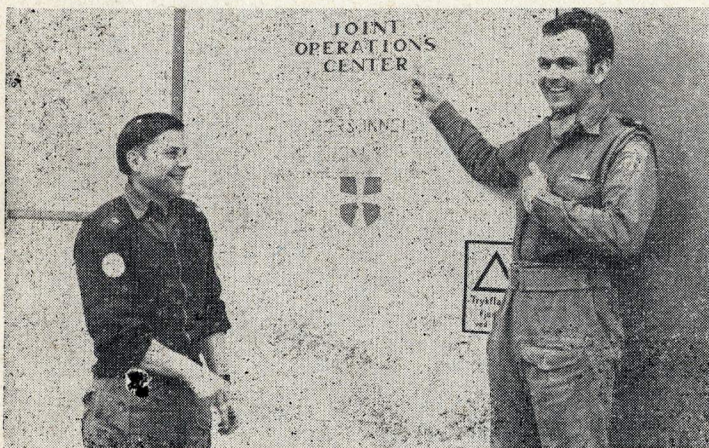

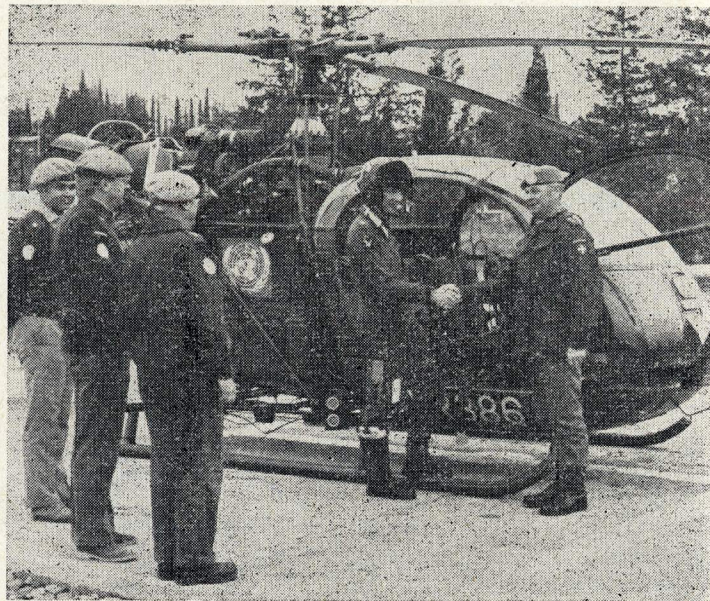

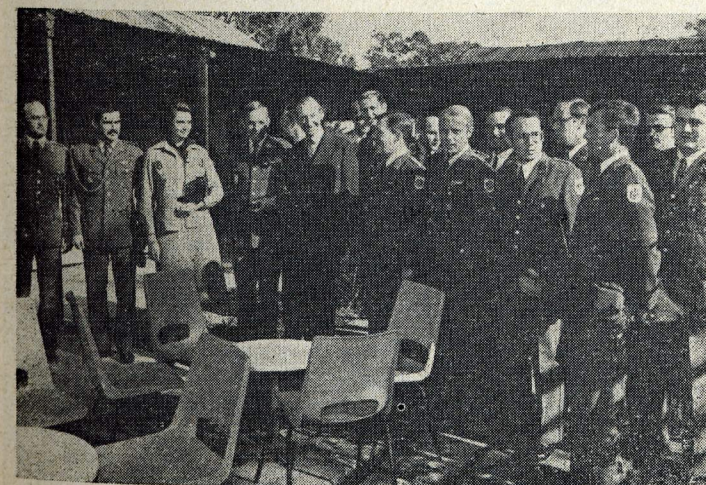

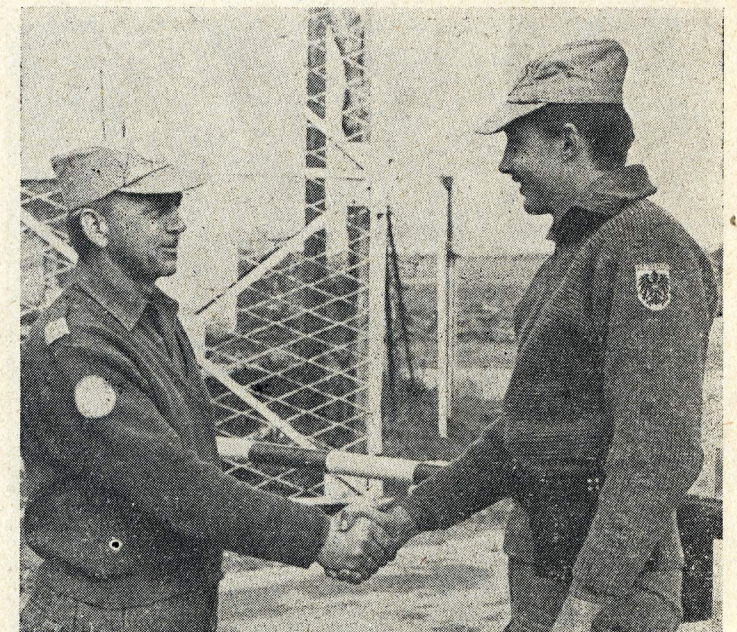
Famagusta and to see and talk to them. Dr Waldheim declared that he takes every opportunity to see the Austrians wherever they serve with the United Nations.

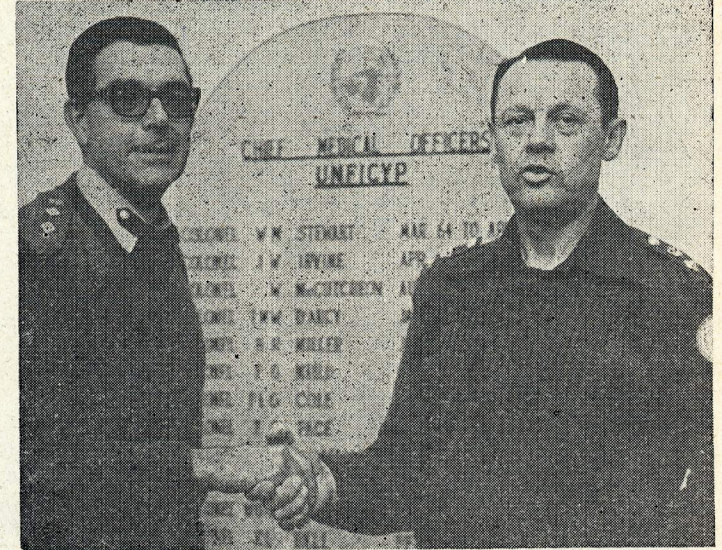


Two of the Western Canada Revue dancers get an opportunity to visit BBC Complex. Here MCpl Lake D.H. tells it like it is.

# HAND OVER TIME IN HQ

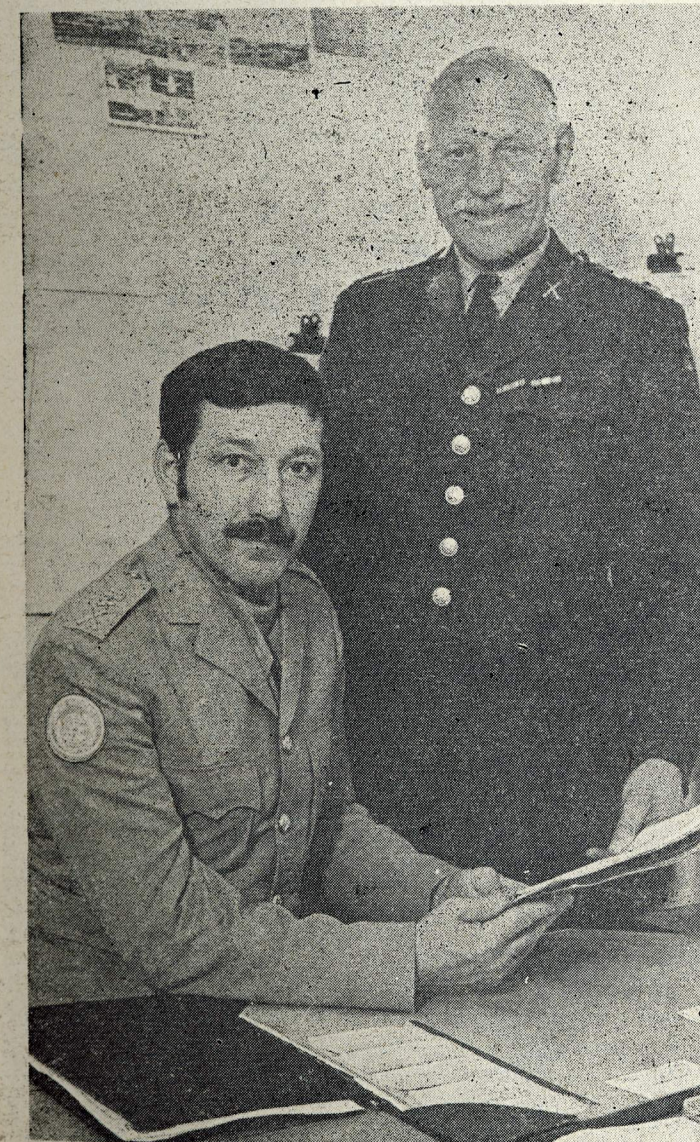

## FORCE COMMANDER PRESENTS LONG SERVICE MEDAL



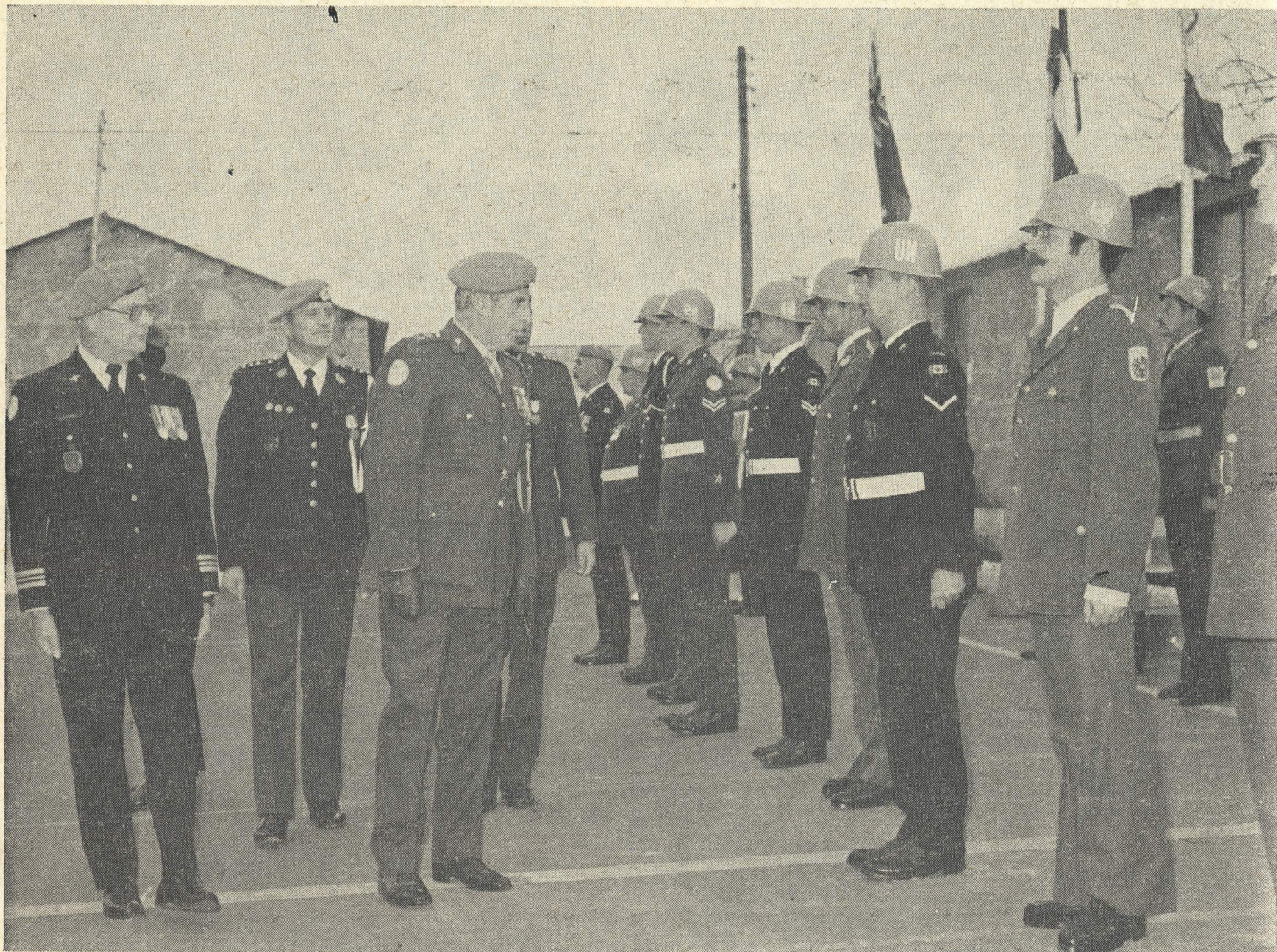
