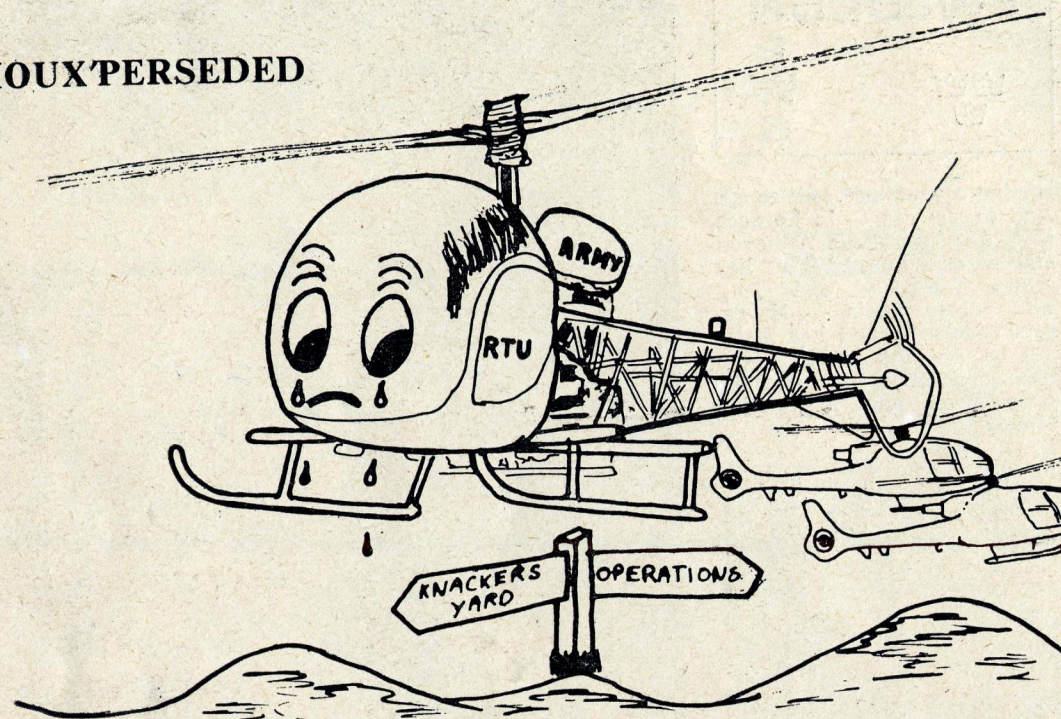

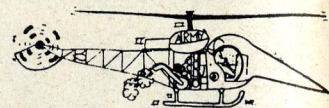
## 'SIOUX'PERSEDED



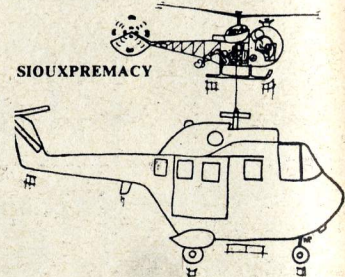
During the next two months the Sioux helicopters will be phased out. The Force Army Air Corps Flight has been equipped with Sioux helicopters since it was formed in 1966, and even before that 21 Flight AAC were equipped with both Sioux helicopters and Auster light aircraft. In the fourteen years the Force has existed these helicopters have flown over 35000 hours in the Service of Peace, which at a approximate 50 nautical miles per hour is the equivalent of our Sioux flying round the world 70 times.

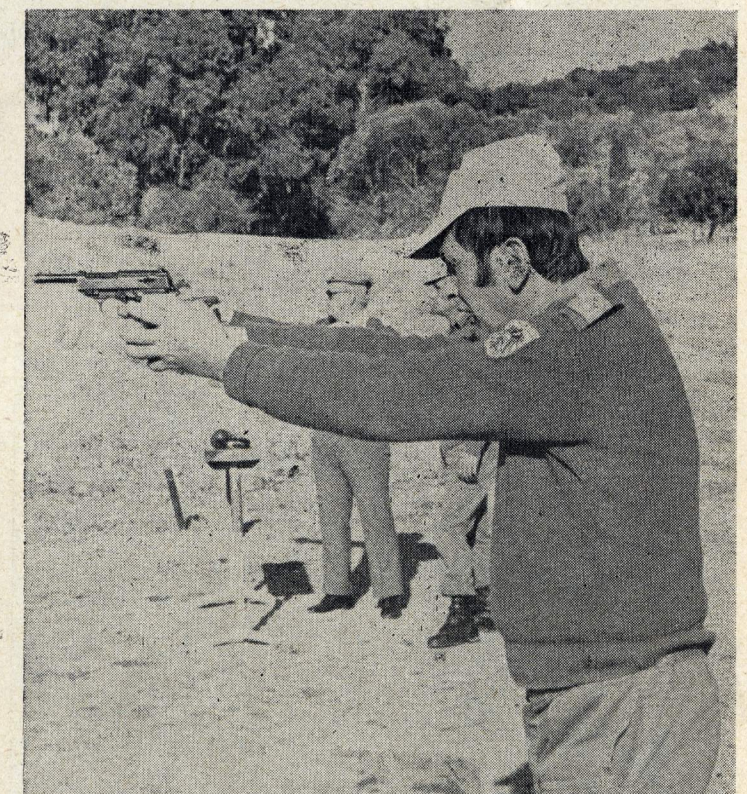

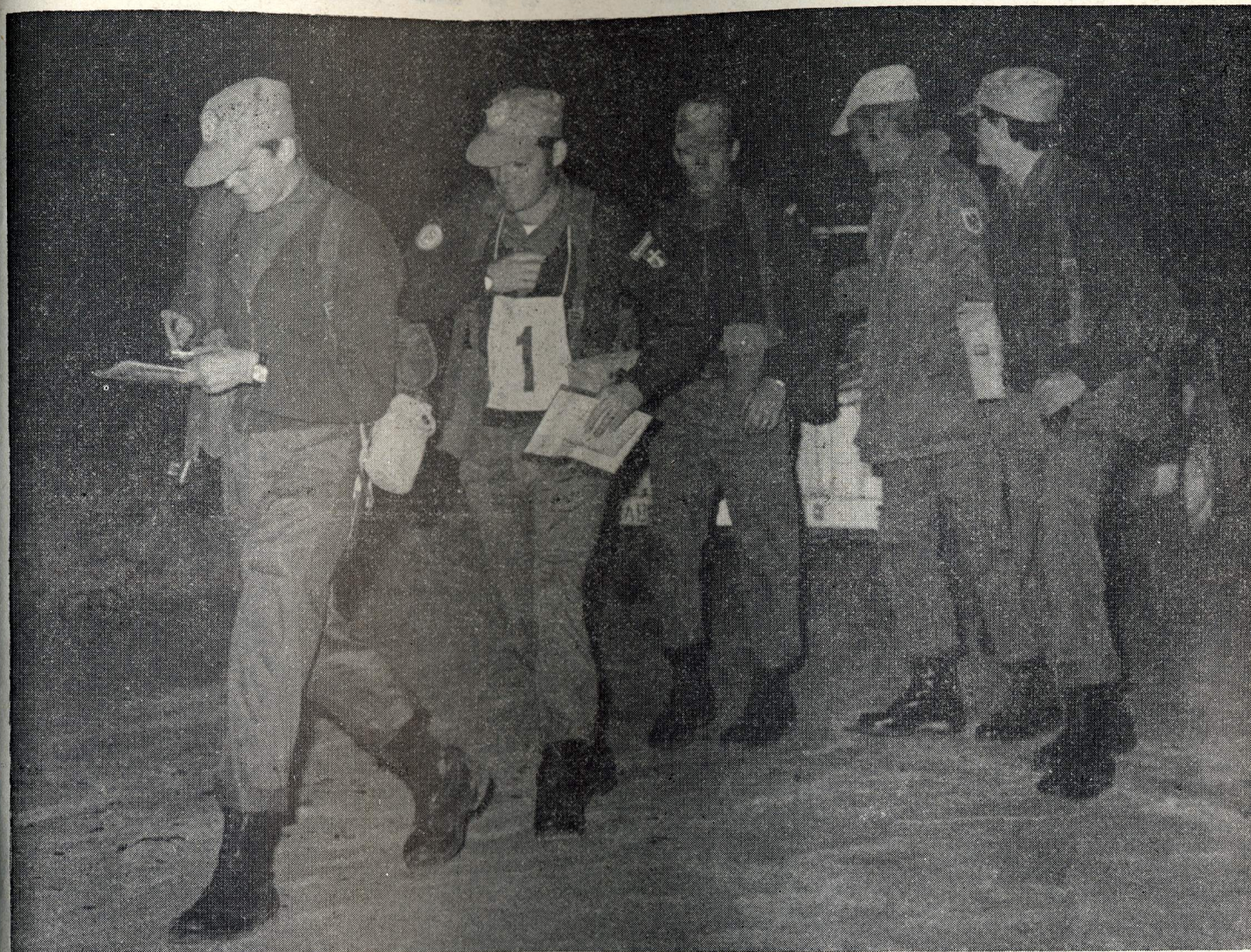


WO Marcipont WV is presented with the Silver Jubilee Medal by LCol J.R. Macpherson.

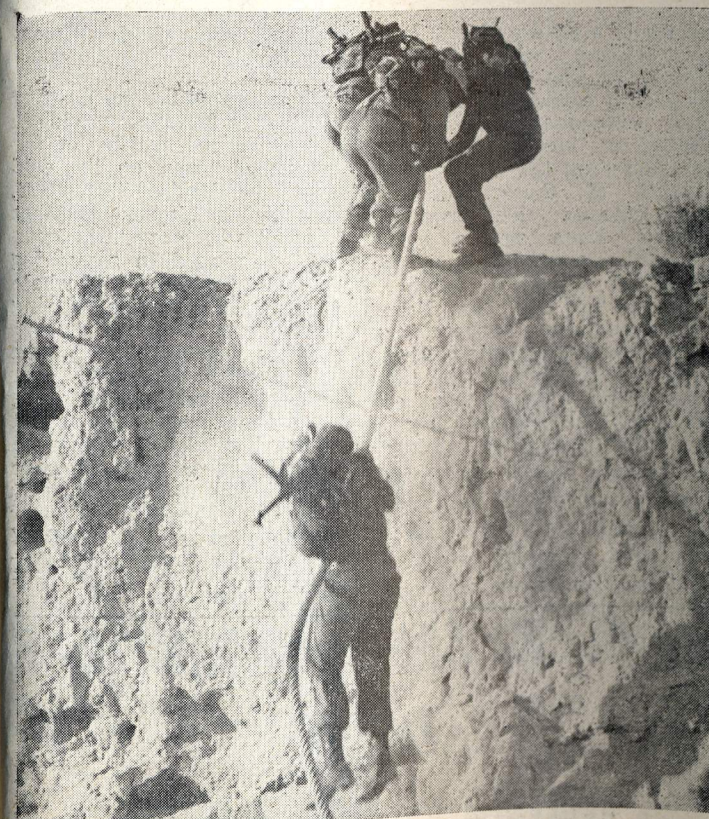


WO Lemoine DG is presented with the Silver Jubilee Medal by Commander Sector 4.

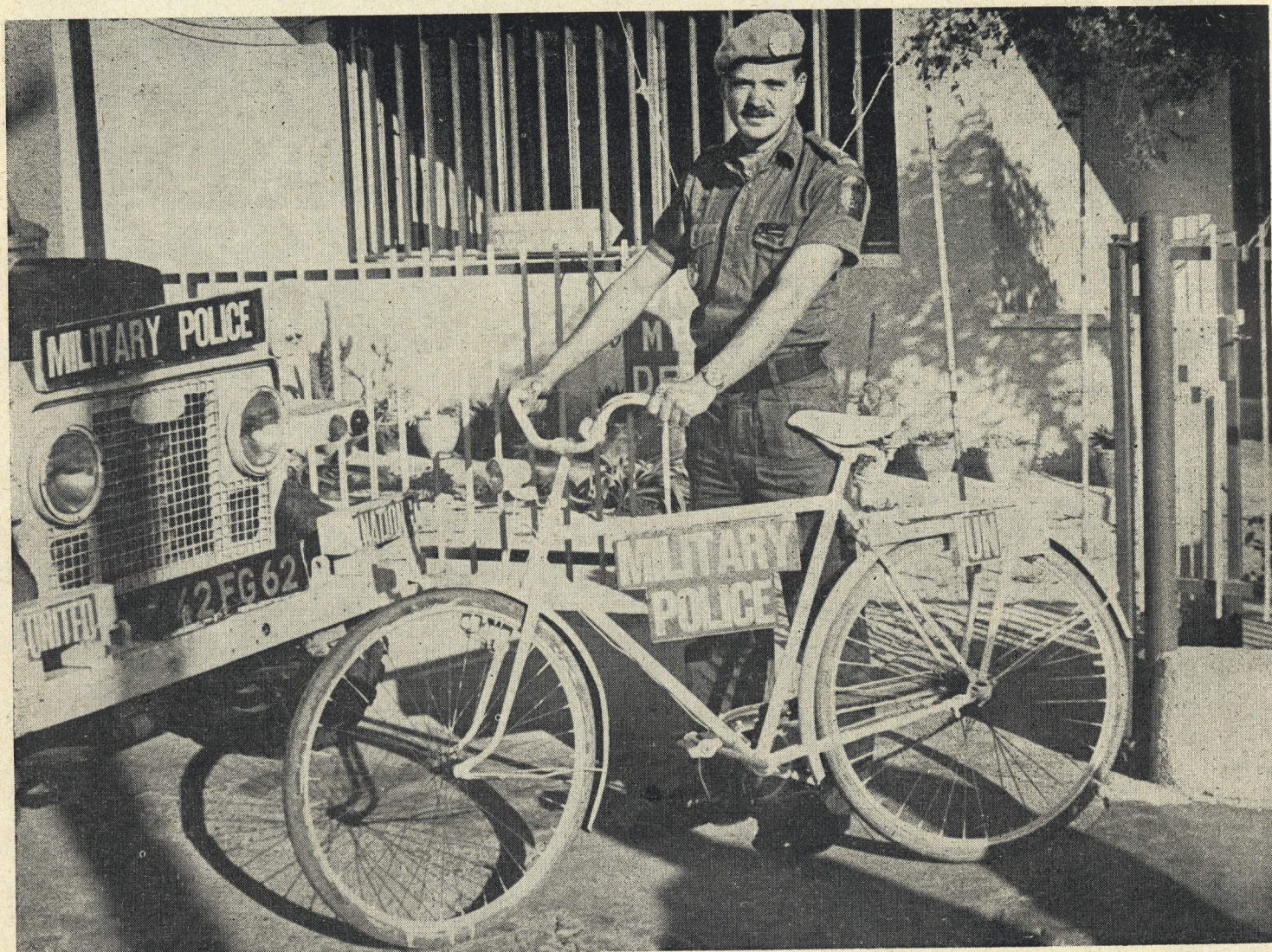
